## <u>Literacy</u>

 Can you create your own wanted poster to try and find the pirates?



- <u>Phonics play</u>: Hidden Treasure game-phase 2.
   Can you drag the coins with real words on them to the treasure chest? Drag coins with fake words to the dustbin.
- Can you design your own treasure map and label the different parts, e.g map, treasure, swap, and parrot. Use your sounds and try to write each sound that you can hear.
- Tricky word challenge: Write the tricky words I, the, to, no, go, into, he, she, we, me, be, you, are, her, all, was, they and my on a piece of paper and stick them to the bottom of a 2p coin. Place the coins in some sand, rice or anything you can find in the house to hide them in. Can you hunt out the coins and read the tricky words?
- Can you write a sentence about each of the pirate pictures? You
  can use the box at the top with the topic words in to help you.

- Practise writing your letter sounds using the support sheet
- Practice reading and writing the tricky words you find in your reading book.

## **Mathematics**

Hidden Treasure. Hide a little bag with some 1p coins in for your child to find. Can you find the hidden treasure and count how many coins you have found. You could even hide 2p coins in your treasure bag and practice counting in 2's to 10.



- Money bag- place a range of coins in the treasure bag and pull one out at a time, can the children identify a range of different coins e.g 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p.
- Using some £1 coins and a mirror can you double the amount of gold coins? Place coins down on the table with a mirror facing them, what is double 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10.



- Position treasure map. Using the attached treasure map and instructions, can you find out which set of instructions takes you to the end, passing the pirate.
- Can you weigh out the ingredients to make your own Pirate biscuits?



- Can you create and make your own pirate hat? (You can use the instructions below).
- Walk the plank. Using chalk draw a line on the ground, can you walk carefully along the line? Can you walk the plank while balancing a beanbag on your head? Or can you walk the plank while clapping your hands/ tapping your shoulders or nodding your head while you walk?
- Can you design your own pirate underpants?



- Can you make your own pirate ship using junk modelling materials?
- Can you make your own pirate biscuits?
