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#### What are we doing this week?

Reception Topic - Where am I? Focus Book - Alphonse, There's Mud on the Ceiling! by Daisy Hirst Personal and Social Development -Understands that own actions affect other people, for example, becomes upset or tries to comfort another child when they realise they have upset them. Children will talk about the feelings of the characters in our focus story and how we can help our friends who are sad. Children will explore the sensory area and be encouraged to use it when they want a little quiet time.

Communication and Language - Responds to instructions involving a two-part sequence. Children will follow instructions in various tasks such as PE, den building and creative activities.

**Physical Development** - Shows increasing control over an object in pushing, patting, throwing, catching or kicking it. PE with Mr. Ellison

Literacy - Gives meaning to marks they make as they draw, write and paint. Children will be encouraged to draw their own story maps to represent their narratives in small world. They will write messages to their friends and put them in the message centre.

Mathematics- Can describe their relative position such as 'behind' or next to. 'Children will create journeys in small world with little "mini mes" and in forest schools and talk about positional language. They will play positional language games.

**Understanding the World** - Completes a simple program on a computer. Children will complete a positional game on the i-pad.

Expressive Arts and Design - Experiments to create different textures. Understands that different media can be combined to create new effects. Children will explore printing techniques after looking at the illustrations in our focus book.

**Class 1**: English- Our core book for this half term is 'Claude in the city'. This week we are creating our own newspaper reports from our police conference all about the robbery at the art gallery.

Maths- Addition and subtraction: Year 1 will be using a part- whole to add objects and numbers together. Year 2 will be using bar models to look at fact families and addition.

Topic/ Geography-This week we are looking at physical features in London and using a Venn diagram to sort physical features in London.

Science- This week we will be going on looking at seasons in the Southern Hemisphere and how they are the opposite to ours. We will also be learning about how seasons differ in different parts of the world

Art- We will be learning all about the artist Wassily Kandinsky and creating our own colour creations inspired by his work.

R.E- We are learning about special religious clothing and talking about when we wear special clothing. We will be matching the religious clothing to the religion.

Computing- We will be using different drawing effects to create different paintings. We will be discussing when to use each effect and why.

P.E- Ball skills and games with Mr Ellison.

Music- We will be learning some autumn and harvest songs.

How to help at home- continue to read 3 times a week. Learn spellings and complete homework which is on class dojo.

#### Class 2

English - This week we will be furthering our knowledge of the Earth's history by learning about the Ice Age, within this we will think about the ice caps and why they are needed. We will also think about the effects of climate change on the ice caps and what we can do to help.

Maths - We will be finishing our 'place value' topic with negative numbers. We will then begin our work on addition and subtraction. We will also spend time on our 3 and 4 times tables.

Science - We will be continuing our work on rocks by researching about Mary Anning and fossils. We will be learning about palaeontology also.

Topic - Our work on the United Kingdom continues this week by learning about the hills and mountains regions around the UK and the activities that take place in these areas. We will be using atlases to help us locate these regions.

RE - We will be looking into Buddhism further by learning about Buddhist Temples and meditation.

PE - Games with Mr Ellison

Art - Our focus in British Art this week is on portraits, we will look into portraits by other artists and then try these ourselves.

French - Recapping our numbers 1-20 and beginning some basic conversation.

Computing - Continuing our work on Scratch Jr.

Learning at Home - please continue to read with your child at least 3 times per week. Any times tables practice would be very beneficial also.

Every week we have a 'prize draw' for those children who have collected their Golden Ticket by reading at least 3 times at home.
