What are we doing in our classrooms this week...?

Reception Topic – Oh I do like to be beside the seaside. Book of the week- Lucy and Tom At the Seaside by Shirley Hughes.

Personal and Social Development- We will continue our transition sessions and spend the whole day in

class one.

Communication and Language – We will talk about our trip to the beach and focus on expressing our ideas

and feelings using full sentences, including use of past, present and future tenses.

Physical Development – We will focus on athletics and team games with Mr Ellison. We will continue to use

a range of small tools e.g. scissors and paintbrushes.

Literacy- We will write about our favourite part of our school trip to the beach on Friday. We will imagine

we are at the beach again and we will send postcards home to our parents. We will continue to follow our

phonics programme and recap the sounds we have covered so far.

Mathematics- We will look at exploring and comparing capacity using the statements, full, nearly full.

nearly empty, half full, half empty.

Understanding the World –We will explore the concept of floating and sinking. We will make predictions

about what we think will float and what we think will sink and we will experiment with a range of objects.

We will also test out some boats that we have created ourselves.

Expressive Arts and Design – We will create representations of the beach using watercolours and a range

of materials. We will take part in 'A Day to Create' with the whole school.

Class 1

English: Our core text is 'The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch' by Ronda and David Armitage. This week we will be writing recounts about our trip to South Shields and sharing them with the rest of the class.

Maths: Our topic is position and direction. Year 1 will be using vocabulary to describe the position of objects such as 'beside, under, behind'. Year 2 will be exploring turns and how we can use these to direct someone such as 'full turn. 3/4 turn'.

History: Our topic this half term is 'Seaside holidays from the past'. This week we will be exploring different artefacts from seaside holidays from the past and comparing them to the objects we would take to the beach.

Design Technology: Our topic this half term is 'Seaside collages and puppets'. This week we will be beginning to make a hand puppet. It is also invent day on Wednesday and children will be designing and inventing new things.

P.H.S.E: Our topic this half term is changing me. This week we will be talking about how we change when we grow up.

P.E- We will be doing team games and athletics with Mr Ellison. Year 2 will be going swimming with Class 2 this half term.

How to help at home: Can your child tell you about seaside holidays from the past?

What's happening in your classroom ...

Class 2

English - This week we are continuing to work on our newspaper articles about Odysseus returning home to Ithaca. We will be writing exciting headlines and ensuring that our writing includes speech from different characters and pictures with captions.

Maths - This week Year 3 and 4 are going to be finishing their work on charts before moving onto properties of shape. We will be recapping what we already know about angles and Year 4 will be identifying different types of angles. Year 5 will be working on angles also, ensuring that they can find angles on a straight line and around a point.

Science - We continue our topic on health and movement this week by investigating how invertebrates are supported. We will be doing research on the computers to help with our learning and creating posters with our findings. Year 5 will be researching about the different planets in our solar system and the order that these are from the Sun. We will be creating a mnemonic to help us remember the order!

PE - Athletics with Mr Ellison on Tuesday and swimming on Thursday. Design and Technology - We will be doing an invent day on Wednesday to help with our design and technology skills.

Helping at home - Please discuss nutritional foods at home, can your child identify the different categories of the food that they eat at home? Do they remember which foods are carbohydrates/proteins/fats and sugars/fruits and vegetables?
