Here are some additional activities you might want to do:	 Our focus the week is comparing capacity and counting in multiples. We will be continuing to follow our school Maths scheme 'White Rose Maths'.  You could research all about moths and find out lots of information about them. You can summarise facts about moths and write them down. You could tell people in your family all about the information you have found out about moths. I will include an example of a non-chronological report. Make a butterfly/ moth feeder by following the instructions. Here is some videos on how to do this: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=19kC1l0F1ik How to make a butterfly feeder: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=m_1P07-LtQc Write a set of instructions for how to make a moth feeder and you can include pictures of how you made one. You could you create a vlog using a phone or use an i-pad on how to create one. 	 Here are some additional activities you might want to do: Can you get a range of containers and put them in order of which will hold the most to the least amount of water? Record how many cups of water each container holds in a table. Was your prediction correct? Can you practice counting in 2's and 10's? You could use chalk to write these outside or count in these multiples going up and down the stairs. Create arrays using sweets or playdough. An array is an arrangement of equal groups of objects in rows or columns. Say show me '3 lots of 5' '2 lots of 3' ect. If your child is ready you could show them the matching multiplication sentence. Set out pairs of socks and get your child to count in twos to see how many socks you have altogether. How many hands altogether in your house? How many fingers altogether in your house?
 Your house? Your house? Can you practise your RWI sounds? You can watch daily RWI lessons at: https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCIg96dxtQ/videos?disable_polymer=1 These would be the same daily phonics lessons that children would take part in at school. Please continue to read every day. Practise your cursive handwriting using the support sheet. Learn how to spell and read Year 1 common exception words. Go on a mini beast hunt. What did you find? Talk about life cycles. You could draw the life cycle of a butterfly and label it. Talk about what mini beasts you have found. Make a mini beast sculpture using indoor or outdoor materials. Try and remember how we made a mini beast sculpture at school. 	
 Create a mini beast hotel and see what creatures come to your hotel. You could keep a daily diary of your mini beasts guests. 	

- Sketch or paint mini beasts. You could paint them on the ground or on a rock. You could even decorate a plant pot with mini beasts.
- Play mini beast themed 'who am I?' using headbands or post it notes.
