

- Read every day.
- Practise writing your letter sounds using the support sheet
- Practice reading and writing the tricky words you find in your reading book.
- Draw a picture of something you have done today and write about it.
- Write a shopping list.
- Practise writing your name/ full name.
- Practice sounding out and blending words such as cat, dog, hen etc and have a go at writing them too.
- Enjoy reading stories together. Can you child retell the story to you?

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Mathematics

- Practise writing your numbers using the support sheet.
- Bake a cake and weigh out the ingredients.
- Play shops and look at all the different coins - can you remember which is which?
- Find 2D and 3D shapes around the house and draw what you have found. Draw your own shape picture and label the shapes you have used.
- Collect a range of items from around the house and count how many you have altogether.
- Create your own number sentences for adding and taking away.

There are lots of other things you could do at home to develop your skills :

- Junk modelling Children could create a model using junk modelling materials.
- Create a stick puppet and re-tell a familiar story (Parents could scribe your story in your exercise book).
- Visit some of the websites below and play on an ICT game.
- Play a game e.g snakes and ladders, hungry hippo etc.
- Make your own musical instrument and perform your favourite song!
- Get out in the garden if you can and see what is growing. Can you spot the signs of signs of Spring and draw what you can see. Maybe you could plant some seeds.
