Sports day this week will be a COVID friendly event without our annual summer fair, cream teas and hundreds of happy spectators! Fingers crossed we'll be able to do more sporting events next year and get everyone back into school to celebrate our happy days!

What's happening this week in our classrooms?

Reception Topic - At the Seaside Book of the week - Billy's Bucket

Personal and Social Development - They adjust their behaviour to different situations, and take changes of routine in their stride. Children will take part in a Sports Day event and The Cancer Run.

Communication and Language - They use past, present and future forms accurately when talking about events that have happened or are to happen in the future. Children will talk about what physical activities they enjoy and what they enjoyed about the Sports Day Event.

Physical Development - Children show good control and co-ordination in large and small movements. Children will take part in a variety of physical activities throughout National Sports Week.

Literacy - They write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others. Children will continue to practise writing super sentences independently.

Mathematics - Automatically recall number bonds for numbers 0-10. Children will work on number bond games which encourage and develop automatic recall of number bonds.

Understanding the World - They make observations of animals and plants and explain why some things occur, and talk about changes. Children will find out about different sea creatures and look at their similarities and differences

Expressive Arts and Design They safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function. Children will create their own sea creature using junk modelling materials.

Class 1: English- Our focus this week is on adding suffixes to words 'er' 'est' and using these to make our writing more interesting. We will be creating our own flyers for Rocket in the story 'Look up'. Maths- Our focus this week is subtraction. Year 1 will be using ten frames and number lines to help us to subtract. Year 2 will be using column subtraction to solve subtraction calculations.

Science- Our topic is plants. Year 2 will be learning to explain why and how seeds are dispersed. Year 1 will be learning about wild plants and how to identify them.

History- We are comparing Felicity Aston's experience of polar exploration with Matthew Henson's. Design Technology- This half term we are making and designing windmills.

R.E- We are learning about Buddhist parables and sequencing the parable of 'The Monkey King'. P.E- Athletics and games with Mr Elllison. We will also be taking part in sports day, football tournaments and the children's cancer run.

How to help at home- Can you read 3 times and learn your spellings?

Class 2: English - This week we will be continuing our work on 'Gregory Cool'. We are going to be considering the differences between the two main characters', Lennox and Gregory. We will then be creating our own storyboard of the main things that happened in the story and how the characters were feeling. We are going to be working on our grammar by learning about subordinating conjunctions and how to use these consistently in our writing. We will also be working on correcting our own punctuation and spelling errors as well as correcting other work.

Maths - This week we will be finishing our work on dividing, we are growing more confident with the short division method. We will also be making sure we are fluent with our division facts within our times tables. We will then be thinking about place value and ensuring that we understand what the different numbers represent, e.g. the 5 in 452 represents 5 tens, so 50.

Topic - This week in topic we are going to be learning about the mummification process in Ancient Egypt and the layout of the tombs.

RE - We are going to be creating our own songs and stories from parts of the bible.

Design & Technology - We will be designing our own Ancient Egyptian masks and then sculpting these from clay, we will be using some of the skills we learnt in our clay workshop last week.

Science - The scientist that we will be learning about this week is George Washington Carver. This will help us further our knowledge in what plants need to grow and survive.

Computing - We will be using Microsoft Word this week and working on our formatting of text.

PE - Games with Mr Ellison, Cancer Run and Sports Day.

Helping at Home - Please make sure that you are reading with your child at least three times a week. Year 3 should be practising their 3, 4 and 8 times tables. Year 4 should be practising all times tables up to 12x12.
