
<u>Home Learning - Reception - Week Beginning 8th June</u>



Topic - Seaside

Billy's Bucket by Kes Gray

Please choose some of the activities below that you would like to complete this week.

Literacy

- Can you draw a picture of your favourite present. Can you
 write a sentence to say why it is your favourite. Try and
 be brave and sound out the words all by yourself.
- Can you draw a bucket or print out the template at the end of the document. Draw what you would like to find in your bucket. Can you write a sentence to say what you can see. Remember that brave writing.
- Can you make up a song about the creatures you may have in your bucket and what they may do. You can sing this song to the tune of "The Wheels on the Bus" For example, "The crab in the bucket goes nip, nip, nip." Can you add actions to your song?
- Find a bucket at home. Go on an adventure in your garden, at home or on a walk outside. Collect objects to put in your bucket. Can you make up a story using the objects you have found.
- Print out the tricky word fish on the attached document. Can you see how many fish you can catch and read.

- Practise writing your letter sounds using the support sheet
- Practice reading and writing the tricky words you find in your reading book.



Mathematics

- Find a bucket and add a strong elastic band to the bucket. You could use an old yogurt pot or similar if you don't have a bucket. Place objects in your bucket and hold onto the elastic band. Place items into the bucket. What happens when you add an item to your bucket? What happens when you add a heavy or light object?
- Set up a shop at home. Choose some items for sale and price them up from 1p to 10p. Can you get twenty 1 pence coins. Choose what you would like to buy from the shop. How much have you spent? How much change do you need? Can you write addition and subtraction number sentences to show what you have done.
- Have cards written out with numbers 1 to 20.
 Select a number. Can you place the correct number of items in your bucket. Can you work out 1 more and 1 less?
- We are sure that on Billy's birthday he would love to play some party games and we think you may like to as well. Put on some music and have a dance! Get someone else in your house to stop the music when you are not looking. Freeze still like a stone statue! Can you do it? How long can you freeze for? Who is the best statue in your house? See if you can play a game of hide and seek. Can you count up or down from 20.
- Everybody loves an ice cream when they go to the beach. Cut out an ice cream cone shape from paper. Choose objects such as pom poms, grapes, cherry tomatoes or cut circles from coloured paper to make repeating pattern ice cream cones.



- Can you look at any photographs you have of a visit to the beach or watch this clip.

- What objects float and sink? Find a range of objects to test. Use the bath or a washing up bowl to see if these objects float or sink. Make predictions before you start about whether you think the objects will float or sink.

- Wrap up different objects. Can you play "Pass the parcel" and guess what the object is before taking off the paper. Can you say what the objects are made from?
- Cut out the Billy's bucket template on the attached document. How carefully can you use your scissors to cut out the under the sea creatures.
