### > English

- Our story this week is: The pirates who lived next door by Jonny Duddle.
   Upload your completed activities to our class dojo page.
- Here are a range of activities for you choose from:
- Make an advertisement poster to encourage people to visit Dull-on-Sea.
- Think of some speech / thought bubbles to accompany the illustrations.
- Create an alternative version of the story, in which a different family move into the house next door to Tilda's house (e.g. a group of aliens or a family of astronauts).
- Retell the story from Tilda's (or Jim Lad's) point of view.
- Write a newspaper article about the arrival of an unusual family in Dull-on-Sea
- Create some character descriptions for the members of Jim Lad's family.
- Write a story about the time that Grandpa's hand was chopped off by the King.
- Do some role-play activities based on the characters in the book. Carry out some interviews to find out how each character feels at different points in the story. What questions would you like to ask the questions?
- Talk about the similarities and differences between Jim Lad and 'normal' girls and boys. Why do Tilda's family want her to be friends with normal children?
- Make a list of the pirate words and phrases that Jim Lad uses and download <u>'How to Talk Like a Pirate'</u> resource.
- Write a letter to the council from the point of view of one of the residents of Dull-on-Sea, in which they explain how they feel about the arrival of this strange family.
- Plan and write a story about a new adventure that the Jolley-Rogers have.

### o Our focus the week is


- We will be continuing to follow our school Maths scheme 'White Rose Maths'. - Here are some additional activities you might want to do:
- Pirate Pete likes to play this game. You will need a washing up bowl with water in and a container that floats. You have 1 minute to throw as many cotton balls or smarties into the container as you can. After 1 minute count how many cotton balls or smarties is in the container. If it is an even number you get 5 points and if it's an odd number you get 10points. You can get an extra 2 points if you scored managed to get more than 10 in the container. Do this 3 times with your family. The winner is the person with the most points.
  - Can you solve these division problems by using the pirates and boats to help you? Write them as a division sentence. Remember they need to be shared equally.
- 9 pirates need to be put on 3 pirate ships.
- 6 pirates need to be put on 2 pirate ships.
- 10 pirates need to be put on 5 pirate ships.
- 12 pirates need to be put on 4 pirate ships.
- Captain Redhat has been struggling to count in tens. Can you count in tens? Can you help him to count these patterns by counting in tens?
