What are we doing this week?

Reception Topic - Where am I ? Book of the week- Alphonse, There's Mud on the Ceiling! by Daisy Hirst

Personal and Social Development- Confident to speak to others about own needs, wants, interests and opinions. Children will express their ideas about books and rhymes they have listened to.

Communication and Language - Maintains attention, concentrates and sits quietly during appropriate activity. Children will listen to stories and rhymes about Autumn and the jungle.

Physical Development - Shows increasing control over an object in pushing, patting, throwing, catching or kicking it. PE with Mr. Ellison

Literacy - Continues a rhyming string. Children will play rhyming games and make up their own rhymes including magic spell rhymes and jungle poems.

Mathematics- Uses the language of 'more' and 'fewer' to compare two sets of objects. Children will take part in a variety of Autumnal comparing quantity activities.

Understanding the World - Beginning to understand that other children might not always like the same things as them. Children will take part in a daily vote to choose the end of day rhyme book. They will be encouraged to discuss which part of our focus book was their favourite. Would they recommend this book to a friend?

Expressive Arts and Design - Begins to build a repertoire of songs and dances. Children will be singing Harvest Festival songs and listening to and joining in with a variety of poems and rhymes.

Class 1 :English- Our core book for this half term is 'Claude in the city'. This week we are writing the ending to our own sequel books about Claude's new adventures and designing a front cover for our books.

Maths- Addition and subtraction: Year 1 will be learning number bonds to 10 and doing lots of activities to help them to learn them. Year 2 will be adding and subtracting 10 from a number. They will also be adding and subtracting multiples of ten from a number.

Topic/ Geography-This week we are learning about what we can do in London in the different seasons and discussing what is the best season to visit London.

Science- This week we will be sharing our knowledge of the different seasons and creating some autumn pictures.

Art- We will be learning about the artist Paul Klee and creating our own Paul Klee inspired pictures using famous London landmarks.

R.E- We are learning about harvest and why Christians celebrate harvest. We will be discussing what we do at harvest time.

P.E- Ball skills and games with Mr Ellison.

Music- We will be learning some autumn and harvest songs. We can't wait to share our amazing singing with you.

How to help at home- continue to read 3 times a week. Learn spellings and complete homework which is on Class dojo. Practice number bonds to 10.

Class 2

English - This week we will be finishing 'The Pebble in my Pocket', we will be recreating our own stories in the same format and creating a timeline of the Earth's history.

Maths - We will be continuing our work on addition and subtraction including carrying over.

Science - We will learn about soil permeability and different types of soil to finish off our topic on rocks. Topic - Our focus this week is on immigration to the UK, we will be learning about the differences in our lives and others' lives as well as using atlases to locate countries on a map.

RE - This week we will be learning about the Tripitaka and different Buddhist symbols.

Art - We will be finishing our work on British Art this week with sensory boxes.

PE - Games with Mr Ellison.

French - We will be ensuring that we know the numbers 1-20.

Learning at Home - It would be very beneficial to work on times tables at home, our spelling rule for this week is -ation, I have uploaded the spellings onto Class Dojo so any work on spellings would be brilliant also.
