- Rapunzel wants you to find 1/2, 1/4 and 3/4 of these amounts of money:

- ▶ 16p

- Problem solving: Rapunzel's hair is 100cm long. How long would it be if she cut ½ of her hair off? How long would it be if she cut 1/4 of her hair off? How long would it be if she cut 3/4 of her hair off?



- Draw a range of shapes and shade in $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, $\frac{1}{3}$ of the shapes.
- Rapunzel thinks $\frac{1}{2}$ is bigger than $\frac{3}{4}$. Do you think she is correct? Can you show me this?
