Here are some additional activities you might want to do:

- Investigate the rhyming in the books. Which words rhyme? Can you think of other words that rhyme with those? Can you write rhyming sentences? You could draw pictures to go with your rhyming words/ sentences.
- Can you make 'The Gruffalo' out of junk modelling or you could draw 'The Gruffalo'? Can you label your model with adjectives to describe 'The Gruffalo' such as 'purple prickles'? You could write sentences to describe 'The Gruffalo' and gave your opinions on him.

## Our focus the week is finding $\frac{1}{2}$ and $1 / 4$

Here are some additional activities you might want to do:
- Draw shapes outside using chalk or pens. Can you split the shapes into halves and quarters? Which shapes can you split in half equally? Which shapes can you split into quarters equally? Why do you think this is?
- Can you make a sandwich for your lunch? Can you cut it in half? How many equal pieces do you have? Can you create and make your own pizza? Cut it in to quarters. How did you do this? How many equal pieces do you have?
- Can you find $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ of these objects? (It might be easier to have $2 / 4$ plates for your child to help put the objects on.)

- Count in multiples of two. You could do this going up and down the stairs, counting pairs of shoes. What number can you go up to?
$\checkmark$ Can you practise your RWI sounds? You can watch daily RWI lessons at:

$\checkmark$ Please continue to read every day.
$\checkmark$ Practise your cursive handwriting using the support sheet.
$\checkmark$ Learn how to spell and read Year 1 common exception words.
- Talk about a woodland habitat. What animals would live in a woodland? What would their habitats look like? Can you make a woodland habitat using Lego?
- Create woodland inspired art. You could make a woodland animal using leaves, grass, sticks, bark, flowers or any woodland inspired art work.

- Go on a scavenger hunt. I have included an example below but you could create your own such as find something yellow, a stick the same size as your hand. You could take photos of these.
- In forest school we love to build dens. You could create a den using outdoor materials for woodland animals.

- Talk about hiberantion. Do you know what woodland animals hibernate? Look at this webite to help you find out more information. https://www.wildlifewatch.org.uk/hibernation
