Virtual Author Visit – Classes 1 & 2. Tuesday 9th November.

We will be taking part in an on-line author event with some of our other nearby primary schools to 'meet' Ross Collins.

We have some copies of his books in school to share before the event and will need to get some questions ready to ask him.

What are we doing in our classrooms this week...?

Reception Topic - Snap, Crackle, Pop! Book of the week- Halloween stories and rhymes.

Communication and Language - We will listen carefully to songs and rhyming stories such as "Room on A Broom", paying careful attention to how they sound. We will play a Halloween "rhyme the room" game.

Personal and Social Development - We will think about the feelings of characters in our stories. **Physical Development** - In PE, we will continue to take part in a range of games with Mr Ellison. We will continue to develop our fine motor skills by making spooky spiders and using tweezers to pick up ingredients for spooky potions.

Literacy- We will be writing Halloween party invitations and spooky recipes for magic spells. We will be following our Read, Write Inc phonics programme. This week we will be learning the letter sounds o, c and k and we will practice writing these letters in glitter.

Mathematics- We will be focusing on the numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 and how we can make these amounts. We will play a Halloween target game focusing on these numbers.

Understanding the World - We will talk about what we did for Halloween and we will talk about what we might do for Bonfire Night.

Expressive Arts and Design - We will make our own Bog Monsters from clay in Forest School and we will make Firework dancing sticks.

Class 1:

English- Our core book this half term is 'The Bluebird and the Robot". This week we will be focusing on adding 's' and 'es' to a word. We will also be making predictions about the story and learning about what a robo is.

Maths- Our topic is addition and subtraction. Year 1 will be learning to add and subtract a 1 digit number to a 2 digit number. Year 2 will be learning how to add and subtract a 2 digit number from a 2 digit number.

Science- Our topic this half term is materials. This week we will be identifying materials from around the classroom and learning about how the materials feel.

History- Our topic this half term is 'The Great Fire of London'. This week we will be learning about The Gunpowder plot and bonfire night. We will be sequencing the events of The Gunpowder plot.

Art- We will be learning about Diwali and creating our own rangoli patterns.

P.E- Mr Ellison will be doing games this half term with a focus on teamwork and basic skills.

R.E- This week we will be learning about Diwali and why and how Hindus celebrate Diwali. We will be making our own diva lamps to celebrate Diwali.

Computing- This half term we will be learning about coding. We will be using the app scratch jr and exploring it this week.

P.S.H.E- This week we will be talking about how to keep safe on bonfire night.

How to help at home- Can you describe the characters in the story book you are reading?

Class 2

English - Our new story for this half term is 'Leon and the Place Between' by Angela McAllister and illustrated by Grahame Baker-Smith. We will be looking at an illustration from the story and predicting what the story might be about. We will be considering what we know about each character at various points throughout the week. We will be creating our own poems using words that we think are effective in the story. We are all going to be working on past and present tense with Year 4 and 5 also using present perfect and simple past tense in their writing.

Maths - This week we finish our addition and subtraction topic, Year 3 will be estimating and checking answers, Year 4 will be estimating answers and subtracting efficiently, Year 5 are using inverse operations and solving multi-step problems. When we begin our new multiplication and division topic, Year 3 and 4 will be using arrays and finding equal groups whilst Year 5 will be multiplying by 10 and 100.

Science - We begin our topic on light this half term by finding different sources of light and learning about light and dark. Year 5 will also be learning where light comes from and try to teach the class about this.

Computing - We will be learning how to take screenshots this week as well as copying and pasting. DT - This week we are designing Viking shields which we will then make using cardboard.

PSHE - We are going to be discussing families this week.

PE - Games with Mr Ellison and swimming on Thursday.
